

Where is the Atzaró Okavango Camp located ?

Atzaró Okavango Camp is situated on the NG/32 private safari concession, located in the southeastern part of the Okavango Delta, a vast inland UNESCO world heritage listed river delta renowned for its expansive grassy plains and waterways, in Botswana. The concession area spans 1,100 square kilometers and is positioned between the iconic Moremi game reserve and the majestic Gomoti Plains.

How do you get to the Atzaró Okavango Camp ?

The main South African international airports of Cape Town and Johannesburg offer direct, daily scheduled flights to Maun in Botswana. The flight time is just over 2 hours from Cape Town, or around 1 hour and 30 minutes from Johannesburg. From Maun, a scenic 25-minute flight aboard a fixed wing aircraft will transport you to the Qorokwé airstrip adjacent to the Atzaró Okavango Camp, an exciting 40-minute game drive away. The recommended breathtaking helicopter transfers from Maun to the Atzaró Okavango camp take around 20 minutes and are the best way to arrive.

Is a visa required to travel to South Africa and Botswana ?

Most nationalities are eligible for a complimentary 30-day visa upon arrival in both countries. It is recommended to verify the latest information by contacting the embassies of Botswana and South Africa for accurate and up-todate visa requirements.

Is travel and health insurance necessary?

We strongly advise that all guests obtain comprehensive insurance coverage, including protection for cancellation, trip interruption, accidents, medical emergencies, and baggage. This ensures your peace of mind throughout your stay.

What is included in the safari trip rate?

What is not included in the Safari trip rate ?

- International and domestic airfares, and baggage fees
- Passport and visa fees, airport taxes, both international and domestic
- Flights and accommodation preceding or following your stay at the camp
- Costs arising from circumstances beyond our control
- Premium and vintage alcoholic beverages, wine, and champagnes from the cellar and Palm Bar
- Spa massages and treatments
- Medical and personal travel insurance
- Fees for national parks, tourism levies, and value-added tax

What is the cancellation policy ?

- Cancellation of a booking 61 days or more before the travel date will result in forfeiture of the 20% commitment fee paid to confirm the itinerary.
- Cancellation of a booking between 60 and 46 days before the travel date will incur a 50% cancellation fee, calculated based on the total value of the itinerary. This 50% fee includes the 20% commitment fee paid upon acceptance.
- Cancellation of a booking 45 days or less prior to the travel date will result in a 100% cancellation fee, calculated based on the total value of the itinerary. This 100% fee includes the 20% commitment fee paid upon acceptance.
- Refunds will not be issued for any activities or travel that were part of the confirmed itinerary but were unable to occur due to events beyond the control of Atzaró Okavango Camp.

Are the suites air conditioned ?

Each of the 12 suites are equipped with air conditioning and the addition of two colonial fans for your comfort. The tented suites are designed with glass windows to optimise energy efficiency and maintain a consistently pleasant temperature year-round.

Is there Wi-Fi internet access available ?

Complimentary Wi-Fi access is available in all of the suites, and in the camp art gallery and boutique. The remote location limits the bandwidth available, but it is suitable for web browsing, emailing, and messaging communication. There is no mobile phone signal at Atzaró Okavango Camp.

Are children welcome at Atzaró Okavango ?

Yes, the Atzaró Okavango Team warmly welcomes families with children. The camp is unfenced, and wildlife often pass through the area, so it is important to ensure that children are under constant parent supervision. Some age-related restrictions apply to various activities for safety reasons, as determined by our guides.

Children 0 - 6 years, sharing with adults

No charge for accommodation. Transfer and conservation levies still apply. Some activities such as walking safaris and mokoro canoe expeditions may have age restrictions and are subject to the guides' discretion.

Children 7 – 15 years

For this age group is 50% of the adult rate. If a child occupies a single room, a single supplement will be applicable. Some activities may have age restrictions for safety reasons and are subject to the guides' discretion.

Children 16 and above

This age group is charged at the full adult rate. There are no restrictions on participating in safaris or activities.

Do you provide laundry or dry-cleaning services ?

Daily personal laundry services are included, subject to weather conditions and water availability. For your convenience, environmentally friendly detergent for handwashing is available in all the suites, and it can also be supplied upon request. We do not offer dry-cleaning services.

Is the water safe to drink ?

At the Camp we have our own state-of-the-art reverse osmosis treatment plant that purifies the drinking water to the highest standards. The bottled purified water is re-mineralised, ensuring its quality and taste. We offer bottled water in environmentally friendly glass bottles all around the camp and in your suite.

What types of safari vehicles do you provide ?

At Atzaró Okavango Camp, we offer custom-built 8-seater safari vehicles that are designed with your comfort and wildlife photography experience in mind. They are equipped to optimise your game drive experience. The seats are covered with comfortable cotton canvas, featuring adjustable armrests that can be locked into position for photography purposes. To add to the spirit of adventure, they are equipped with amenities for memorable refreshment stops, including tables, chairs, cold boxes, hot boxes, and picnic baskets.

Can you meet all dietary requirements?

The skilled chefs are adept at catering to a wide range of dietary requirements, whether you have specific dietary needs or preferences. We recommend providing advance notice of your dietary requirements so preparation can be made for meals that meet your needs.

Is there a dress code ? What clothing should I bring ?

There is no specific dress code at Atzaró Okavango Camp, as we want our guests to feel relaxed and comfortable throughout their stay. For game drives and excursions, we recommend lightweight, neutral-coloured clothing. The Camp provides a daily laundry service at no additional cost, allowing you to pack less clothing. Please avoid bringing any clothing with a military or camouflage pattern, as wearing such patterns is discouraged in Botswana.

What is the best time to visit?

The Okavango Delta is a destination that offers something special throughout the year, each season with its own unique qualities and experiences. The Autumn and Winter months, from May to October, are considered the high season and are commonly regarded as the preferred time to visit, perfect for summer trips for those from the USA and Europe. Perfectly positioned, in both the wet and grassy regions, wildlife viewing is guaranteed year-round at the Atzaró Okavango camp.

During the High Season, water born activities, such as a mokoro canoe expeditions, are common, whilst in the Emerald Season, spring arrives with the birth of thousands of new antelope for visitors to enjoy. The big cats of course follow these herds to the delight of those visiting in the shoulder seasons.

May-October

This period corresponds with the high season when the Delta fills with waters from as far away as Angola, and wildlife congregates, making game-viewing especially rewarding with the lack of vegetation and increased visibility. The floodwaters gradually rise, peaking around the end of September, when Spring arrives.

November - April

Referred to as the green or Emerald Season due to the onset of rainfall, this period, particularly January and February, is ideal for photography, birdwatching and viewing herds of newborn and young antelope throughout the concession's extensive network of grassy plains. Predators hunting the newborns can make for captivating game viewing experiences during this period.

What temperatures can be expected ?

The temperature variations in the Okavango Delta offer distinct experiences throughout the year.

May-August

These Winter months bring the most pleasant temperatures, with afternoons hovering around 20c or 68F. Occasionally, cooler weather might lead to a slight drop in temperatures. This period is comfortable for outdoor activities. Nights and early mornings can be cold and go down to 7c or 44.6 F so warm safari clothing should be packed for the early morning hours.

Late September - November

Temperatures start to rise during late September, then October and November are the hottest months of the year. During these months, temperatures can range between 28c or 82.4F and 36c or 96.8F. This warmer period requires appropriate summer attire to stay comfortable during the heat of day and consideration should be given to summer clothing.

December onwards

From December onwards, the temperatures gradually cool down. Daytime averages range from 28c or 82.4F to 32c or 89.6F, offering a more moderate climate for activities and exploration.

Are there any luggage restrictions ?

When preparing for your safari to Botswana, it's advisable to pack efficiently. For charter aircraft or helicopter flights, the maximum luggage allowance is 20kg (44lb) per person. You are also allowed one piece of hand luggage or a camera bag. If space permits, you can reserve additional seats to accommodate excess luggage. Booking extra seats allows for an additional 70kg (154lb) of luggage.

It is important to consider not only the weight but also the shape and dimensions of your luggage. Your bags need to fit within the cargo pod beneath each helicopter or aircraft. To ensure convenient transportation, we recommend using soft-sided holdalls or duffel bags instead of rigid hard suitcases. If your luggage doesn't fit in the cargo pod, it will need to be carried inside the aircraft, incurring additional charges.

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Do I need vaccinations ?

Planning a visit to Botswana, it is important to consider certain vaccinations. It's highly recommended to consult your doctor or a healthcare professional to determine the vaccinations that are relevant and necessary for your specific health needs and travel plans. Additionally, keep in mind that specific areas of Botswana may be considered malarial, so discussing malaria prevention strategies with your healthcare provider is also crucial for a safe and healthy trip.

What about Malaria ?

The Atzaró Okavango Camp is situated in a remote area with a very low risk of malaria. We do however recommend taking precautions. It's advisable to use anti-malarial prophylactics as a preventive measure. To ensure your health and safety, we recommend consulting your doctor or a healthcare professional at least three weeks before departure to Africa. They can provide personalised advice and recommendations based on your individual health profile and travel plans.

How can I pay for extras ?

Payments for additional services and purchases such as spa treatments, spa products, and items from the Atzaró Okavango Camp gallery and boutique can be conveniently made at the location. You have the option to pay using either cash or credit card. We accept various currencies including Botswana Pula (BWP), Pounds Sterling (GBP), Euros (EUR), South African Rand (ZAR), and US Dollars (USD). Additionally, we welcome major credit cards such as MasterCard, Visa, and American Express for your convenience.

What are the guidelines for tipping ?

Gratuities are always appreciated by the staff, but they are entirely at your discretion. Our staff are committed to the highest standards of hospitality and wish to make your experience exceptional. Should you wish to express your satisfaction with the service, we offer the following suggestions.

Guides and Specialist Guides

You may choose to provide a direct one-time payment to the guide at the conclusion of your stay.

Mokoro Canoe Polers

It is customary to offer payment directly after the service. This team is from the local village and we recommend tipping them if your experience warrants it, as this their key source of revenue.

General Camp Staff

A one-time payment at the end of your stay is customary. We collect these contributions in a communal tip box, which is then distributed evenly among all the staff except for the guides. Please note the gratuities to guides or staff are made in cash.

What is your smoking policy ?

Smoking and the use of e-cigarettes are only allowed in designated areas of the camp, which our staff will identify upon request. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the main camp area, safari vehicles, mokoro canoes, and guest suites. However, you are welcome to smoke on the outdoor decks of your private suite. During game activities, there will be designated stops for refreshments, during which smokers may enjoy a tobacco moment of their choosing.

Do you allow drone cameras at the Atzaró Okavango Camp?

The use of drone cameras is not permitted at Atzaró Okavango Camp. This policy is in place to safeguard the well-being of the wildlife, preserve the privacy of our guests and staff, and adhere to local regulations and protected area guidelines. It is important to consider that drones can potentially disturb animals and pose risks to the environment. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to this policy.

Are there running paths at the Atzaró Okavango Camp ?

Whilst we prioritise the safety of our guests, we regret to inform you that jogging or running in the bush is not recommended due to the presence of wild animals in and around Atzaró Okavango Camp area. However, an alternative for your fitness routine is available with the fully equipped gym facilities. Alternatively, please book a bush walk. The safety of our guests is of utmost importance, and we encourage you to enjoy your exercise within the designated gym area for a secure and enjoyable experience.

Is the Atzaró Okavango Camp sustainable ?
